A Do It Yourself Study Guide on Daniel and Revelation

Dear Friends:

I hope this little booklet proves to be helpful. I have diagramed the seventeen apocalyptic prophecies in Daniel and Revelation to demonstrate this rule: "Each apocalyptic prophecy has a beginning and an ending point in time and the events in each prophecy occur in the order given." I have not found one exception to this rule.

As you study through these charts with an open Bible, you should notice two phenomena. First, each prophecy contributes to a story that is much larger than itself. Second, all seventeen prophecies perfectly align with each other to produce a giant matrix of events from the past as well as the future. This timing matrix enables us to determine our chronological position within God's plan to save mankind.

You will notice that certain portions of Daniel and Revelation are not charted. This omission occurs because some passages in Daniel and Revelation contain commentary about events that were presented earlier or they are about to be presented. Revelation 17 is an example of this type of commentary. For purposes of comparison, I have also included three charts that show competing interpretations.

Of course, it's only a matter of time until all prophetic views are proven to be true or false. With this thought in mind, I hope you will examine the prophecies with eagerness because God has promised a great blessing to everyone who studies His Word.
